**MYPONYCLUB – NEW MY PONY ACCESS EXPIRATIONS**

Access to MyPonyClub needs to be renewed using the correct application forms (found under the management tab then go to forms on the website) please note that the current access will expire as of the **31st January 2021**.

As per **motion C28/20** That commencing 2021 PCA NSW affiliations and renewals only be available online and payable by credit/debit card all clubs must have an authorised access holder and complete an audit of current membership to ensure that members have valid email addresses for 2021 renewals to be processed.

Each club may have two authorised access holders and forms can be found under the management tab – forms on our website <https://www.pcansw.org.au/management/forms> the office will be contacting all clubs who do not have an authorised access holder in the next few weeks.

Clubs and Zones will need to update their bank account and contact details and update their fees prior 2021 for renewals to be processed, contact the office for support with this process.

**INFORMATION FROM NOVEMBER MEETING**

*Motions not in bold were lost.*

**C54/20 That the ages and classes for the State Tetrathlon and Formal Gymkhana Championships be accepted as below.**

**Tetrathlon**

Classes and ages – to go on schedule

Introductory class – shooting, running, and swimming the same as Nationals schedule but riders may jump in lower grade with penalty points deducted as outlined below. Juniors and Seniors allowed one grade lower, and Sub-Juniors allowed up to two grades lower. Riders must be signed off by their Club and Zone Instructors as being competent at these heights.

**National Class**

Scoring: 1400 points if 0 jumping and 0-time penalties. Elimination in the Riding Phase is not elimination in the entire completion.

**Novice Class**

	Max Height	Speed	Efforts	Will Include
Sub-junior	60cm	350 m/min	12-18	Max 2x doubles Slip rail Gate
Junior	70cms			
Senior	80cm			

Scoring: 1400 points awarded if 0 jumping and 0-time penalties. Elimination in the Riding Phase is not elimination in the entire completion.

Novice Class Only: For riders competing in the Novice class only, a second lower height will be offered for all age groups at 10cm lower that the listed height. If Novice riders choose to compete at the lower height, 200 penalties will be deducted from the score.

Therefore, classes offered will consist of:

Sub juniors National 75cm

Sub junior Novice 65cm or 55cm with 200 points deducted

Juniors National 85cm  
Juniors Novice 75cm or 65cm with 200 points deducted  
Seniors National 95cm  
Senior Novice 85cm or 75cm with 200 points deducted

*Rationale: Based on feedback from Nationals, this would encourage riders to gain an introduction to Tetrathlon without the limitations of their showjumping ability.*

## **Formal Gymkhana**

**Classes and Age Groups for Formal Gymkhana** –age groups same as other State Championships Under 13 years, 13 to under 15 year, 15 to under 17 years and under 26 years. With riders to compete in the following classes:

Hack and pleasure class  
Rider and bare back class  
Jump – under 13 years E, D grade  
13 to under 15 years E, D, C grade  
15 to under 17 years D - B grade  
17 to under 26 years D - B grade  
Courses set up for each grade and riders to ride in grade not age and scoring to reflect the grade that rider jumped in.  
Sporting races – Flag, Bending, Mug and Barrell races.

**C55/20** That the recommendation from the Tetrathlon Advisory Committee regarding rider's safety be accepted as below and included in NSW rules and the program.

**TET6/20** That for riders' safety at PCA NSW Tetrathlon events during the ridden phase a mounting block be provided within a rider's box (marked on the ground) for riders use when dismounting/remounting for the slip rail. Riders must be in full control of their mount before moving outside of the rider's box, including being seated in the saddle with both feet in the stirrups and holding the reins. If a judge deems the rider not to be fully in control a penalty may be imposed (see diagrams for dimensions/details).

*Rational: As this is a new discipline being offered the Tetrathlon Advisory Committee want to establish safe habits from the start.*

**C58/20** That the application to host State One Day Event Championship in 2021 by Zone 2 Harden be accepted.

**C59/20** That the application to host State Showjumping Championship in 2021 by Zone 10 Bowral be accepted.

**C60/20** That the application to host State Mounted Games and Team Sporting Championship by Zone 16 Bungendore be accepted.

**C61/20** That the application to host State Tetrathlon and Formal Gymkhana Championship by Zone 7 Merriwa be accepted.

- C62/20** That the application to host State Jumping Equitation Championship by Zone 2 Harden be accepted.
- C63/20** That the application to host State Showriding Championship by Zone 9 Nana Glen be accepted.
- C64/20** That if an application for the State Sporting and Campdraft Championships was received that the State Executive decide on its suitability.

**Motion 1 – Zone 9**

- C65/20** That the Zone Chief Instructors Meeting and the Pony Club Association of NSW Council meeting the venue for these meetings change from Campbelltown Sydney to Maitland/Newcastle. (lost)

**Motion 2 - Zone 20**

- C66/20** That a pro-rata PCA NSW Membership fee to apply where a member joins after 1 July in a calendar year. The pro-rata fee will be set when all other fees are set. (lost)

**Motion 3 - Zone 20**

Amend the Rule to:

- C67/20** Section 9 – Showjumping Rules - Competition Rules

For all disciplines, the following to apply:

At Zone/Club Level competitions, riders may be permitted to participate on more than one horse in a competition. Only one horse may be competitive in each competition and any other entries will be non-competitive. Each horse entered must have attended the minimum number of club rallies and where required by the discipline be appropriately graded.

The decision to allow more than one entry per rider will be at the discretion of the host Zone/Club for the event. (lost)

- C68/20** That the notification from Hargraves Triamble being in recess be accepted.
- C69/20** That if an application for the State Team Penning Championships was received that the State Executive decide on its suitability.

**FEES FOR 2021**

**Riding Membership** - \$76.50 per rider

**Non-Riding Membership** - \$40 per person and \$20 for the second non-riding member per family

**Regional Schools** - \$30 per rider total of 18 riders

**State Championship** entry fees - \$40 per rider fee, First Aid fee \$15 per rider for all Championships, administration, stable and camping fees will apply for each championship and will be included in the schedule.

**State Camp** - \$250 per rider

**Clinics/Seminars** - \$20 per PCANSW member and \$50 per non-member.

2021 Memberships will be online only payable by credit/debit card, members must read the online risk warning form and confirm their acceptance of risk prior to finalisation of payment. All members 18 years and over must also complete a Child Protection declaration (form enclosed in this mail out) with completed forms to be held by the club. PCA NSW recommends that all members 18 years and over hold current Working with Children Checks which have been verified by the Club (see WWCC section below).

## RESUMPTION OF SPORT UNDER COVID SAFETY GUIDELINES

PCA NSW clubs and zones can conduct all activities under the current NSW Health and Office of Sport guidelines. All clubs and zones must have completed a return to sport risk assessment and Covid Safety Plan and submitted the same to the State Office prior to holding their activities and events.

Example risk assessments, Covid Safety Plans and Covid-19 Self-declaration forms can be found on our website <https://www.pcansw.org.au/management/risk-management> to help clubs. Example risk assessment have now been updated so that they do not solely focus on Covid safe practices, however they do not take into consideration all activities that may be conducted at pony club and clubs should include all risks and what risk mitigation strategies relating to their venue and the activities they will be conducting.

Clubs and zones also need to monitor the NSW Health website and incorporate any recommendations, restrictions etc. into their risk assessments and Covid Safety plans as listed <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/latest-news-and-updates>

This is a great time to reach out to your members/parents to help with risk assessments, Covid Safety Plans as many of your members/parents will already be dealing with similar issues in their

workplace. Clubs and Zone must appoint a Covid Safety Coordinator, this position is not instructional, so it is another good role to offer to non-instructor parents.

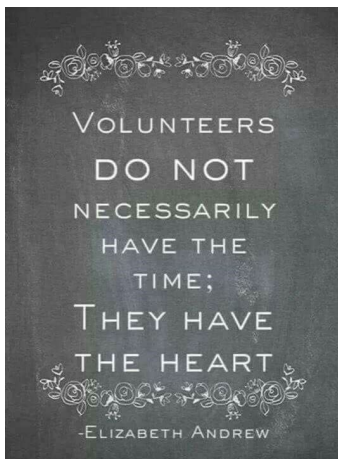
NSW Health and their authorised representatives will be checking on community sporting clubs to ensure that they have Covid Safety Plans (hard copy available at the activity/event) and that members are following all Covid safe practices including: staying home if unwell, social distancing, good hand washing hygiene and the wearing of face masks when social distancing is not possible. PCA NSW highly recommends that everyone attending PCA NSW activities and events wear a face mask when not riding.

## **INCORPORATION**

All Clubs and Zones are reminded that they must be incorporated each year as part of their affiliation process with PCA NSW. Clubs and Zone must send in an annual return (form A12) after their AGM each year to the Department of Fair Trading along with payment. ### **REMINDERS**

#### **WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)**

All clubs should now be compliant with the Working with Children Check regulations and registered as an 'employer/organisation' to verify their 'employees/volunteers'. A club's status must be reviewed every year and clubs need to complete a risk assessment on anyone 18 years and above to ensure that they are compliant with the Act, website for more details [www.pcansw.org.au](http://www.pcansw.org.au).

It is **illegal** to use a volunteer who has been deemed as needing a Working with Children Check that has not provided their Working with Children Check registration number and been verified unless they have been classified as exempt by their club/zone. Please ensure that records of all roles including their WWCC number of exemption status are held by the authorised persons within the club/zone as audits will be conducted.

It is also **illegal** to utilise a volunteer who has been banned under the Working with Children Check registration system, which is why it is so important for clubs to be registered as 'employers' and for clubs to verify members so that they can be contacted in the event that a volunteer has been banned.

Clubs must also remember that their Child Safety obligations do not end with Working with Children Checks, clubs need to be mindful of having Child Safe policies and practices, Play by the Rules have some terrific online courses and resources for clubs please see their website for full details - <https://www.playbytherules.net.au/>

#### **CONFLICT RESOLUTION**

There are very clear and defined regulations regarding disputes within Pony Club (see the PCA NSW Handbook and Member Protection Policy). Clubs and Zones should appoint a Member Protection Information Officer (MPIO) to help members with any queries and information regarding rules, regulations, and advice on how to deal with complaints. In all cases conflict should be handled at the lowest level within Pony Club as possible i.e. the channel of communication should be **Member → Club → Zone → State**, this is in accordance with the Australian Sports Commission guidelines.

Member Protection Policy (which the Association has adopted) conflicts or complaints may be dealt with informally or formally and all complaints should be dealt with promptly, seriously, sensitively and confidentially.

All queries and or disputes should be referred in the first instance to the Club/Zone Secretary or President. Complaints should be handled in line with the Member Protection Policy and either referred to an outside mediator, contact Community Justice Centres <http://www.cjc.justice.nsw.gov.au/> or Voluntas <http://www.volunteering.com.au/voluntas/> for help and free mediation or if mediation is unsuitable a Disputes Tribunal Panel may be formed by contacting solicitors from the Australian & New Zealand Sports Law Association (ANZSLA) who list solicitors who are willing to participate on a panel usually pro bono, please see their website for details <http://anzsla.com/content/sports-tribunal-referral-list>

All policies in relation to Codes of Behaviour and our Member Protection Policy as well as several other policies can be found on our web site under the Policies tab then go to the general policies. PCA NSW follows the Australian Sports Commission and Communities of Sports and Recreation guidelines and the Association takes these matters seriously.

## ASSOCIATIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

All members are reminded that upon joining Pony Club Association NSW they accept the Associations, Constitution, By-laws, Code of Conduct, Membership Protection Policy and All other policies that the Association adopts from time to time. Any member who breaches any of the rules of Pony club including the Code of Conduct may face disciplinary action. Full details of these policies and procedures can be found on the Associations website under the policy tab.

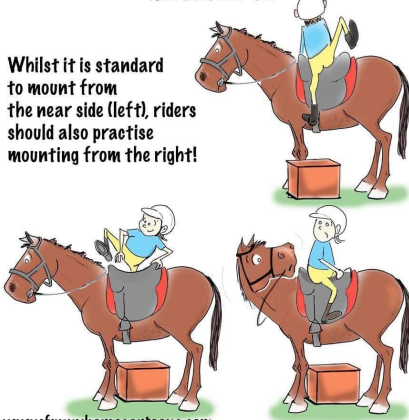
Please remember that all Club, Zone and State Office Bearers are volunteers and should always be treated with respect. These volunteers take on positions to ensure that Pony Club continues as an organisation for your children and while they are open to feedback, members should always be considerate and treat others as they would like to be treated.

## WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (WHS)

As you would all be aware the Code of Practice 'Managing Risk When New and Inexperienced Riders or Handlers Interact with Horses In The Workplace' came into effect as at 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017. The impact on Pony Club should be minimal as we were already using the Guide which was in effect prior to 1<sup>st</sup> February. ### MOUNTING TIP

Whilst it is standard to mount from the near side (left), riders should also practise mounting from the right!

## **PAID INSTRUCTORS AT PONY CLUB**

Zones and Clubs are reminded that only those instructors listed on the Paid Instructor Panel list are permitted to be paid for giving instruction at Pony Club. A list of the current PIP can be obtained from the state office or be found on the web site [www.pcansw.org.au](http://www.pcansw.org.au) under the coaching tab.

Please note the change to the procedure as per C62/18 That members of the Paid Instructors Panel be paid directly by the host zone or club. Clubs should still complete the booking form and submit it as notification of the instruction to the office however they may pay those listed on the panel directly.

*Please note that if clubs/zones use and pay for an instructor who is not on this list they will forfeit Pony Club insurance cover and may be held personally liable in the event of an accident or incident during this instruction.*

## **NCAS SCHOOLS, SPECIALIST AND REGIONAL SCHOOLS**

Zones are reminded that there is a \$550.00 refundable deposit fee for all schools. This fee is refunded once the school has been completed. Cancellations of schools and NCAS assessments will incur this fee unless postponed or cancelled within the required time frame i.e. the last working day four weeks before the school is booked for.

The **2021** fee of \$30.00 per rider applies to all Regional Schools and a \$20.00 fee for PCA NSW members and \$50.00 fee for all non PCA NSW members for Specialist Schools with a minimum of 18 attendees.

This fee is due when booking the school and should be sent as a separate cheque to the refundable deposit. Schools can only be booked through ZCI's and forms can be obtained by contacting Jane Frankum on 02 4229 8977 (Wednesday only) or emailing [coach@pcansw.org.au](mailto:coach@pcansw.org.au).
